The first half of 2026 has been one of significant progress for ACTB Foundation. Across our 63-acre site in Rogbere, we have **continued to invest in children, young people and families** through integrated programs that provide education, care, opportunity and hope.

Over the past six months, we have strengthened our schools, expanded vocational training, welcomed a new child to Roselene House of Hope, **launched our agricultural demonstration project with Just Earth**, and hosted our **first ever inter-community disability sports event**, celebrating inclusion across three local communities.

Alongside these highlights, our sports academy has continued to nurture young talent, while our community programs have created new opportunities for learning, wellbeing and development.

While challenges remain, we are encouraged by the progress being made as we continue creating brighter futures for hundreds of children and families and strengthening the community that we serve. **We are grateful to everyone who partners with us** in this work and hope you enjoy reading about all the progress being made.

Education: Building Brighter Futures

Education remains at the heart of ACTB Foundation's work. During the first six months of 2026, we have focused on **enhancing academic credibility** while continuing to provide holistic support for every student. Alongside improvements in teaching and learning, we have further embedded a **biblical curriculum that encourages Christian values**, character development and a deeper understanding of faith, helping students grow **not only academically but also spiritually**.

📌 Major Achievement

Official approval as a **WASSCE Practical Examination Center**. This reflects significant improvements in our facilities and teaching standards, allowing students to complete science practical examinations within their own school.



Examination Readiness 71 final-year students were accommodated on-site during the examination period, receiving focused revision and pastoral care.



Leadership & Responsibility Students participated in structured community service projects, developing practical life skills while contributing to the Foundation.

Agriculture & Food Security: Growing What We Eat

The Just Earth Partnership

Launched in 2026, this exciting collaboration with Just Earth is transforming part of our 63-acre site into **a hub for sustainable farming**. Alongside strengthening food security and providing practical agricultural education for students and the Rogbere community, the program is rooted in **Kingdom Life School**, a wholly biblical curriculum that explores God's design for creation, stewardship, work and community. In July, two of our oversight staff will travel to Kenya, flying for the first time, to join a gathering of Just Earth participants from across Africa, deepening their knowledge and strengthening relationships across the network.

Independent Living Unit

This unit demonstrates what is possible when young people with disabilities receive consistent, long-term support. Several young adults are now studying at university while living independently, **building confidence, developing life skills and preparing for meaningful futures**. Their achievements are a powerful reminder that, with the right opportunities and encouragement, disability should never define potential.

Church Community

Over the past two years, **generous supporters have invested more than \$175,000 into capital projects** including our Community Centre and church building, refurbishments to existing buildings and the launch of our agricultural program. While these one-off investments have transformed our site, our greatest need remains sustainable operational funding. We currently face a funding gap of around **\$5,000 per month** to help cover staffing, feeding, education and day-to-day operations that keep these programs running.
